*Rockland Winter Dryland Trials on Kress' Farm: Go to Rockland on Hwy. 37. Passing through Rockland travel another 13-14 miles south. After passing around a Butte on right side of road proceed past Pollard Rd Proceed one more mile and turn right onto Windy Canyon Rd. There is no sign for road name. Proceed west about 2 1/2 miles passing the gravel pit road.

About 3/4 mile before shop at end of the road are the plots on the right or north side of the road. There is a narrow field access point to enter the field.

**Soda Springs Winter Dryland Trials: When entering Soda Springs turn right on 4th south street towards the Hospital and proceed south about 1/4 mile to stop sign. Turn right at stop sign and proceed on Reservoir Road and travel 1.6 miles passing the Dead End sign to Balls Road. Turn left to the south and go 1/2 mile south just passing the power line. Plots are on the left side of road to the east about 125 feet into field.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Entry

- 1. The Livestock Quiz Bowl has one division. Each county in Idaho is invited to enter up to three teams.
- 2. The cost to enter the contest is \$40 per team. Lunch IS NOT provided. Money for the teams must accompany the registration in order to be qualified to attend.
- **3.** Entries are due by Friday June 20, 2025. All contestants must enter online. Entries after that date will NOT be accepted. **No late entries.**
- **4.** An Extension Educator from the participants' county must approve the registration in order to validate the registration of the teams. Registration will be online this year.
- 5. Coaches will be given the opportunity to review their team entry prior to the contest.
- 6. Changes to teams will not be allowed on the day of the contest.

Eligibility:

A team consists of four individuals and one alternate (if desired). Contestants must be currently enrolled 4-H members through ZSuite and approved by the county extension office. Contestants must already have reached his or her 8th birthday prior to January 1, 2025, and may not have reached his or her 19th birthday, before January 1, 2025. If a team has one or more members who are under 14 years of age, that team will be ineligible to qualify for the competition at Western 4-H Roundup in Denver, Colorado. Contestants must be on a team in order to participate.

Team:

A team will consist of four members, plus one alternate. An alternate can be substituted at the conclusion of any phase in a round. No substitutions are allowed within a phase, unless the moderator deems that an individual cannot continue in the competition. Recommended procedure for Quiz Bowl team member substitution is as follows:

- 1. Each team may name an alternate and the alternate is expected to attend all rounds of competition in which their team participates.
- 2. If an alternate enters play, he/she must remain in the contest for the rest of that phase.
- 3. Substitution during the contest needs to be approved by the moderator. In the event that a four-member team enters the competition and one member is unable to continue the competition and there is no designated alternate, the resulting three-member team will be allowed to continue; however, they will forfeit the Phase I questions directed toward the fourth team member.

Anita Wanstrom Memorial 4-H Scholarship

The Anita Wanstrom Memorial 4-H Scholarship is conducted and funded by the Wanstrom Family. The Anita Wanstrom Memorial 4-H Scholarship will be awarded yearly to applicants based on their 4-H experience. There will be a preference for applicants who raise, train, or breed their own livestock. This scholarship is being offered in the memory of Anita Wanstrom.

One of Anita's greatest joys in life was training animals and instilling that love and knowledge in the hearts and minds of her kids and the kids in our community. The Wanstrom Family would like to honor her by rewarding a 4-H member who has either raised or trained their own animals for 4-H over the last few years.

One scholarship per year will be awarded in the amount of \$500. Participation in a livestock show is a requirement for consideration.





General Requirements

- 1. Be an enrolled member of a Bingham County youth 4-H program for the current year and at least two of the three previous years for a minimum of 3 years of enrollment.
- 2. Be an Idaho Resident.
- 3. Be scheduled to graduate from an Idaho High School (public, private, or home) during the 2024-2025 school year.
- 4. Have applied to enroll with intent to attend any college or university, trade school, or have a plan to join the US Military.
- 5. The scholarship recipient MUST BE PRESENT at the Bingham County livestock sale to receive the scholarship.
- 6. The application must be complete and correct once submitted for consideration. Any application deemed incomplete or incorrect will be disqualified from consideration.
- 7. Applications must be submitted to the Bingham County 4-H office by 11:59 PM MST by June 15th.

When: July 8 and 9, 2025 @ 9:00 am - 5:00 pm. Participants should plan to arrive on time and attend for the entirety of the class.


